# MARION HARGROVE

1922 - 2016 V Obituary Condolences



Marion Smith Hargrove 1922-2016

Marion Smith Hargrove, a native Houstonian, died suddenly on June 24, 2016, in her home. Cheerful and optimistic, she often said, "I've enjoyed a wonderful life. I wake up every morning and tell myself, Marion you be grateful today."

Born September 16, 1922, to Thomas Marion Smith and Elizabeth "Bettye" Callaway Smith, she lived an eventful life through eventful times. Growing up in the days before air conditioning changed our city, she and her friends could find cold watermelon or popsicles on a hot day at Houston Cold Storage Warehouse, managed by her father. She learned to drive on Westheimer, "a twolane street with ditches on either side." She graduated from Lanier Middle School, (where she first met her eventual husband, Jim Hargrove), Lamar High School and Rice Institute, where she became the first woman editor of the school paper, The Thresher. She married Jim Hargrove in August of 1942. After

remaining in Houston during the war years, the couple and young children moved to Shreveport in 1946 where Jim worked for Texas Eastern Corporation. They returned to Houston in 1959. In 1969, the family resided in Washington, DC, while Jim served as Assistant Postmaster-General. Marion was glad to return to Houston in the early 1970s.

In 1976, she and Jim moved to Canberra, Australia, where he was the US Ambassador. Marion, a skilled and gracious hostess, thrived in the diplomatic life there. She also cultivated a passion for travel, which she first pursued with Jim, and later with her daughter, Flo Ray, continuing to travel in her 90s. A lover of arts and music, Marion was active for many years in the River Oaks Garden Club, served as a docent at Bayou Bend, and supported the Houston Symphony and the Ballet, as well as the Museum of Fine Arts Houston and the Houston Museum of Natural Science. A lifelong Presbyterian, she was a faithful member of the Women's Circles and a former moderator of the Presbyterian Women. She developed a keen interest in nature in her later years, especially birdwatching along the Texas Coast. She supported organizations such as the Audubon Society, Gulf Coast Bird Observatory and Galveston Bay Foundation. Her other hobbies included reading and needlepointing, where she created many beautiful works.

She is survived by her children, James Ward Hargrove, Jr., and wife Linda; Florence Hargrove Ray; Thomas Marion Hargrove and wife Gloria; and William Henry Hargrove and wife Lynn; as well as her sister Carol Smith
